Cronulla clubhouse open

The redeveloped Cronulla Surf Life Saving Club was officially opened recently. Read about the work being done as part of the NSW Government's investment in local surf clubs on page 2.

Help with the cost of living

The NSW Government is supporting family budgets and stimulating the economic recovery from COVID-19 with a range of vouchers and other support available.

This Cronulla Update runs through some of the help available and how you can access the savings.

Surf clubs update

Our local Surf Life Saving Clubs (SLSCs) have recently opened or started work on new and improved facilities to help the clubs and their members to continue to do their vital work, while also providing new facilities for the community to enjoy.

Cronulla SLSC opened its redeveloped and refurbished clubhouse last month.

The new clubhouse provides modern facilities for members and the community and also makes sure it complies with current building and safety standards.

The NSW Government provided \$500,000 towards the cost of the renovations, which will meet the modern day needs of the club and the community.

The new building provides members with stateof-the-art facilities so they can continue to provide the voluntary lifesaving service on Cronulla Beach they have been doing for 115 years.

North Cronulla SLSC celebrated the start of construction of its new club with a ceremonial sod turn.

The project will provide a much needed modern operational facility for the club's hardworking volunteers.

The NSW Government supported the project with grants totalling \$500,000.

Elouera SLSC marked the completion of its lower ground floor renovations that will help with the training and development of its members along with providing better facilities for the community.

A NSW Government grant of \$320,000 helped fund the project, which includes improved amenities for women and special needs nippers, a new gymnasium and new training and first aid rooms.







Cost of living help

As NSW recovers from the impacts of COVID-19, there's a range of savings available to help ease the cost of living.

You can use a savings finder to discover savings relevant to you by visiting service.nsw.gov.au/campaign/cost-living or by scanning the QR code below.

These are some of the savings you may be eligible for:

Stay NSW vouchers provide \$50 off the cost of staying at hotels, motels, caravan parks and other accommodation.

Parents NSW vouchers offer parents, carers or guardians of school-enrolled children who supported home learning in 2021 with \$250 worth of vouchers to use for accommodation bookings or entertainment and recreation activities.

First Lap vouchers provide \$100 towards the cost of swimming lessons for children aged three to six years not enrolled in school, or in kindergarten in 2021 or 2022.

Active Kids vouchers are two lots of \$100 to use towards sport and active recreation costs each year.

Creative Kids vouchers offer \$100 for registration, participation and tuition costs for a range of creative activities.

Dine NSW vouchers have been expanded to offer each person aged 18 and over a third \$25 voucher to use for dining at restaurants, wineries, pubs or for takeaway meals.

Discover NSW vouchers have been expanded to offer each person aged 18 and over a third \$25 voucher for entertainment and recreation.





Before and After School Care (BASC) vouchers offer families \$500 per child to support the cost of accessing BASC services. The voucher is to be used to cover the cost of the parent gap fee under the Child Care Subsidy.

Small business support is available for eligible businesses, sole traders or not-for-profit organisations impacted by the Omicron wave of COVID-19, with payments of between \$750 and \$5,000 per week.

Free rapid antigen test (RAT) kit packs are available for students and staff through schools to use when families consider necessary so they have peace of mind.

Cronulla Seagulls clubhouse upgrade

I recently joined Minister for Sport Stuart Ayres to open the new facilities that will mean safe and secure change rooms are available for women of all ages.

The upgrade also means the Seagulls clubhouse is fully accessible for people with disability.

Sutherland Hospital upgrade

Construction of new state-of-the-art operating theatres and a new MRI suite is on schedule at Sutherland Hospital.

The new and refurbished Sutherland Hospital operating theatre complex will increase the number of operating and procedures rooms from six to ten and include a new surgical short stay unit, a new MRI suite and new central sterilising services.

The \$88.5 million upgrade will give Sutherland Hospital a first-class operating theatre complex that will significantly improve the patient experience and cater to a growing population well into the future.



The world-class MRI facility brings this vital service closer to home for Sutherland Shire residents. The MRI facility is due to be open to patients in 2023 and the operating theatre complex is scheduled for completion in 2024.

News in brief

- The Cronulla Jazz and Blues Festival is on again from 2 to 5 June. The NSW Government is supporting the event with a grant of \$11,000: cronullajazzandbluesfestival.com
- 18 medical interns have been appointed to Sutherland Hospital, in a record intake of more than 1,000 interns across the state.
- Work has started on the mostly underground M6 Stage 1 south to Kogarah. It is due to open to motorists in 2025: caportal.com.au/rms/m6
- The NSW Government is providing financial assistance for people, businesses, farmers and notfor-profits impacted by severe weather and flooding in NSW: nsw.gov.au/floods
- NSW has posted its lowest unemployment rate since current records began, falling 0.5% to 3.7% in February. This is the lowest unemployment rate of any state.
- Stronger environmental laws are now in place to better protect the environment, prevent contamination and illegal dumping: https://bit.ly/3qHZ1rq
- The NSW Government's response to the closure of Origin Energy's Eraring Power Station will support up to 3,700 jobs in future energy and renewable energy: https://bit.ly/3JPY7kk https://bit.ly/3JQGnVL

Attorney General update

- Common sense reforms to make sexual consent laws easier to follow and ensure more effective prosecutions of sexual offences will begin on 1 June 2022.
- Offenders whose criminal acts cause the loss of an unborn child will face tougher sentences under new criminal offences now in place. This will expressly recognise the loss of an unborn child as a unique injury for a pregnant woman and other family members: https://bit.ly/3qKZTvE
- The NSW Government is working on reforms to outlaw coercive control in current and former intimate partner relationships.
- Perpetrators of sexual violence and other criminals who've evaded the criminal justice system for many years, will now face the prospect of tougher sentencing from NSW courts.
- New 'safe rooms' are being installed in NSW courthouses to enable domestic violence complainants and other vulnerable witnesses to give their best evidence in court. This will help witnesses avoid the stress of having to face their abuser or family members in court.
- Audio visual links are continuing to be installed in courts across the state to enable more efficient court operations and reduce the time people have to wait for justice. By mid-2022 modern audio visual links will have been fitted in almost 180 courthouses since 2017.

Community Building Partnership grants

12 local organisations in the Cronulla electorate have secured a total of \$400,000 for projects through the NSW Government's 2021 Community Building Partnership Program.

The program funds infrastructure projects for improvements to facilities for hardworking local community groups.

The following projects were successful in the latest round of applications:

- Cronulla South Public School P&C (upgrade of classroom and outdoor learning space) \$70,000
- Wanda Surf Life Saving Club (upgrade to lift) \$50,000
- Yowie Bay Public School P&C (new nature adventure garden) \$50,000
- Laguna Street Public School P&C (upgraded outdoor seating area) \$45,000
- Cronulla High School P&C (motorised lighting winch system) \$40,000
- Cronulla Recreation and Bowling Club (updated sun protection shades) \$34,000
- Cronulla Public School P&C (water bottle refill stations) \$30,000
- Woolooware High School P&C (renovation of multi-purpose hall floors) \$30,000
- Elouera Surf Life Saving Club (ground floor refurbishment) \$20,000
- Sunnyfield (renovation and upgrade of kitchen at Caringbah) \$14,000



- St Aloysius Church, Cronulla (refurbishment of audio visual system) \$12,000
- Cronulla Seagulls Football Club (outdoor shade and weather protection) \$5,000

I congratulate the local organisations that have been successful in their applications and look forward to seeing the difference these projects make to our community.

It was great to be able to open the refurbished netball and basketball courts at Lilli Pilli Public School, a project supported by a NSW Government Community Building Partnership grant.
